#### Where were we?

In our previous newsletter from the end of December 2023 you read what we all did last year. Despite that 2023 would be a 'gap year' for us, we have been very busy behind the scenes setting up the foundation, the solar panel project in the APDK clinic, setting up a sponsorship campaign after floods in Mombasa and of course the many activities that have been organized. The installed solar panels provide major savings on energy costs for the clinic. The money that is saved will be provided as a contribution for the following projects. Finally, on New Year's Day, just after the previous newsletter came out, we baked and sold more than 900 "oliebollen" to raise money for our work trip to Kenya in July 2025.

## Visit Cathy at our projects

Our secretary Cathy Erbrink recently traveled to Kenya to visit the APDK clinic and Oyiengo Primary School, where we will be undertaking projects next year:

"In recent weeks I have been in Kenya to visit our projects of next year. Yes, You read that right: projects. First of all, I spent a few days in Mombasa, at the APDK-clinic. The therapeutic swimming pool that we completed in 2022 is in beautiful condition. To be sure that it is sufficient, I followed their therapy in the swimming pool with a number of children. What a pleasure to see those children working so diligently and having a lot of fun at the same time. It's very satisfying to see this. I also got to see the new roofs of 2 dormitories with solar panels on them. Especially the workshop, where orthopedic instruments are being made for the children, benefits greatly from this. Delivering the service they want every day. Power all day every day. No longer having to send people home and have them come back again in the hope that there will be power. Awesome. And the financial department is completely enthusiastic. The bills had gone up considerably recently and now with the solar panels they are 99% down. The savings amount to approximately €7,000 -€8,000 per year. This will be used for the investment in projects 2025-2028. Worth a party. We also discussed what we will do next year. The roof will be repaired, but not by us, a local company will do that. We are going to make murals for the children in the dormitories and also in the dining room. We can probably start thinking about what comes next.

I also visited the APDK Bombolulu workshop that was so badly affected by the rains late last year. They are getting back on their feet and are aware that climate change could make it happen more often. They are already preparing for it. The stuff from the ground in the houses, a waterway and at the deepest point a water wheel. Top.

I then flew to Kisumu where we will also be doing a project next year. We made contact with the Oyiengo Primary School through the Kadowinja foundation. We are also going to paint here, but just the walls. The walls are dark and clearly in need of a makeover. We are assisted by the Kisumu women's football team. Fortunately, there was also time for relaxation, although that was also about next year. We shouldn't miss the beautiful sunrise on Lake Victoria, but to be able to talk about it with passion, you first have to see it yourself!



All in all, a successful trip that has strengthened ties with APDK and generated new contacts in Kisumu. We are already looking forward to next year, time can't go fast enough for me."

For the KASH 2024-2025 project, we are still looking for some young people (16 years or older at the time of departure) who would like to join our enthusiastic team.

The project has 2 phases, the first of which takes place in the Netherlands. The trip includes a multi-day safari from Nairobi to Kisumu, watching the sunrise at Lake Victoria, the fish market in Kisumu and trips inside Mombasa.
